The freshman football team was the defensive platoon Tuesday afternoon as the first and second varsity clubs practiced their offensive patterns before head coach Len Casanova and his crew of assistants.

In the hour-and-a-half session, the Webfoots rehearsed blocking drills on punt returns, with Tom Crabtree seeing lots of action in the safety position. And later, George Shaw practiced conversion efforts, after booting two Saturday against San Jose State.

Regular halfback Dick James was back in action after missing the Spartan fray with an injured leg. The speedy pass-receiving ace worked with Shaw, Jasper McGee and Lloyd Powell in one backfield. John Keller, Larry Rose, Tom Crabtree and

Hank Loumena made up another foursome.

Pointing their workouts toward the annual battle with the Washington Huskies on Saturday in Seattle, the Ducks will attempt to move out from under the jinx that has seen them beaten five consecutive years.

The veteran seniors of this year's Duck team were freshmen in 1951 when the Hugh Meihenny-led Huskies smashed the Oregon club 63-6 in Multnomah stadium. It was 49-0 with Don Heinrich directing UW in 1952 and last year the men from Seattle squeezed out a 14-6 victory.

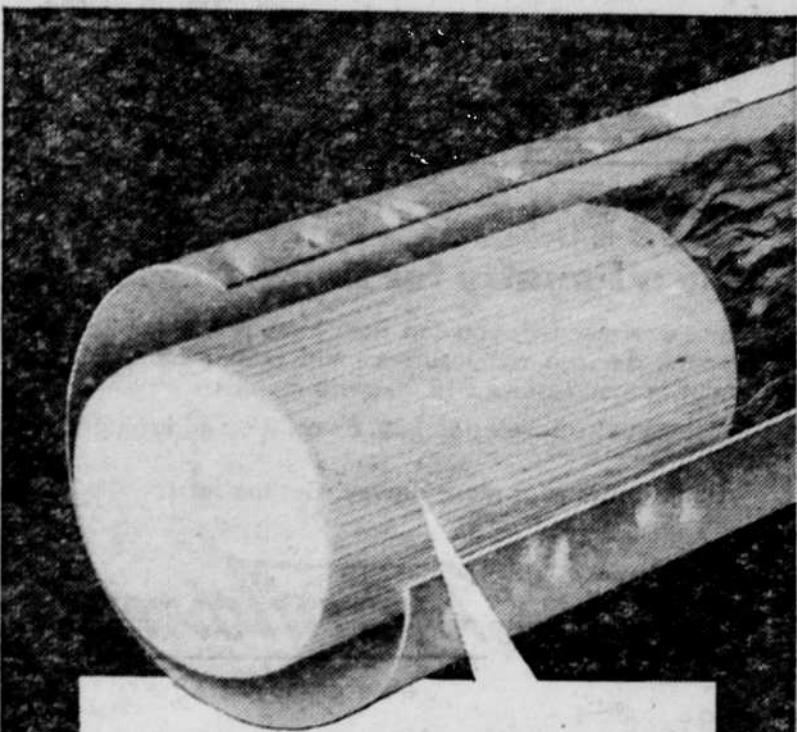
Coach Johnny Cherberg scheduled the hard work for later in the week.
