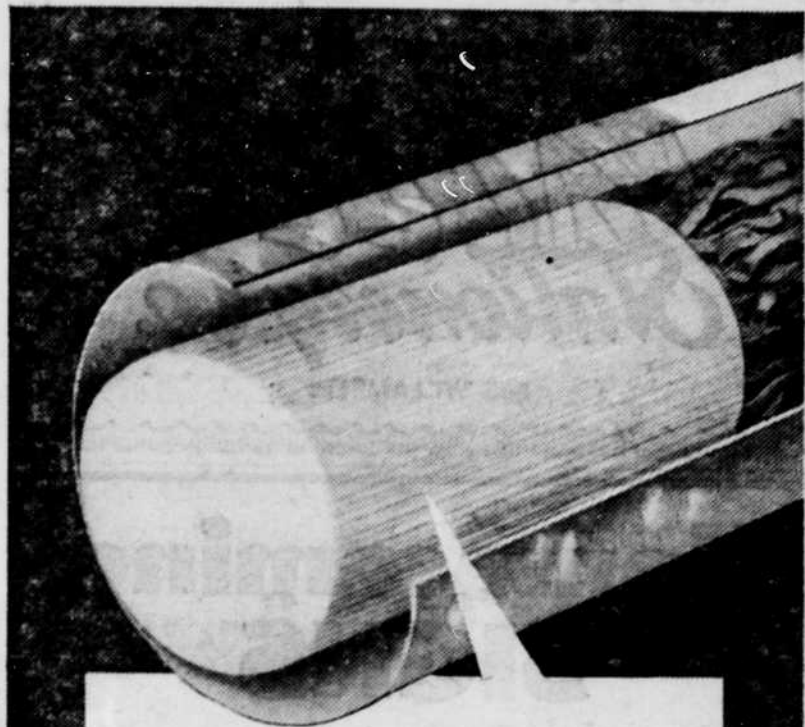


Physical Plant Five Leads With 19-9
