# WRA Changes Rules Affecting Women Athletes

Changes in the by-laws of the Women's Recreation association, recently passed by the WRA council, will directly affect houses participating in intramural sports or any phase of WRA activities, according to Nikki Powell, president.

The awarding of the participation cup will be based upon the percentage of the living organizations' membership participating in the various WRA activities, rather than the number of points, as in former years. Another change is that this cup will be presented the winning house each term, rather than annually, she announced.

Participation points are earned by individuals for their living organizations through intramural sports, membership in any of the three WRA clubs, Amphibians, Outing and Hockey, working on committees of the special WRA activities, the water show and carnival, and by holding an office in the WRA council.

Fall term's intramural program consists of bowling and volleyball. In addition to the participation cup, rotating trophies are also presented the tournament winners by the organization.
