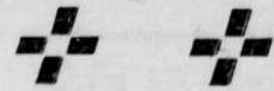


Religious Notes

the state. The program gives one year of theological study to outstanding students in the United States and Canada so they may consider entering the ministry. It is sponsored by the American association of theological schools. Selection of state representatives to handle nominations is made by the religious and spiritual activities of the faculty.
