Shaw Selected On Shrine Team

Quarterback George Shaw, at the present time the nation's total offense leader, has been selected on the West team for the annual Shrine East-West football game in San Francisco Jan. 1.

The announcement of Shaw's selection was made to Coach Len Casanova by William M. Coffman, general manager of the Shrine classic. Shaw is the first of a possible three Webfoots to be selected for the game. There is a limit of three players from any one school.

Francis Powers, director of public relations, has intimated that there are eight vacancies left on the West team.

Shaw, in addition to leading the nation in total offense with 1415 yards in nine games, is a four-year letterman and has been in the starting lineup in all but two of Oregon's games over that period.

He missed the starting lineup on two occasions this year when he suffered a leg injury. He broke into college football playing first string defense during the era of two-platoon football, and his freshman year set the present NCAA record of 13 pass interceptions in a season.
