

Hale Kane Defeats Phi Delt, Takes Both Volleyball Titles

Trojans Get Expected Bid

LOS ANGELES-(AP)-The University of Southern California was chosen Monday to represent the Pacific Coast Conference in the 1955 Rose Bowl game at nearby Pasadena next New Year's Day.

The expected formal announcement was made by Victor O. Schmidt, Pacific Coast conference commissioner.

The USC Trojans lost to their cross-town rivals, the UCLA Bruins, 34-6, in Los Angeles Memorial coliseum last Saturday. USC has run up a total of 234 points to 116 for its opponents.

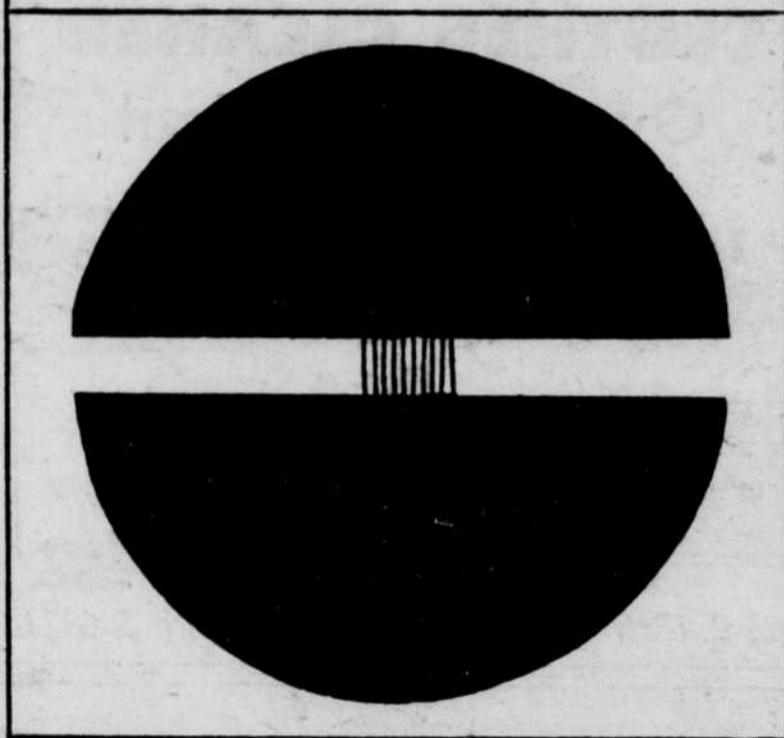
In the third game, however, a determined Hale Kane team reversed the roles and won 15-5. It was almost a direct reversal of form for both teams as the champions won easily.

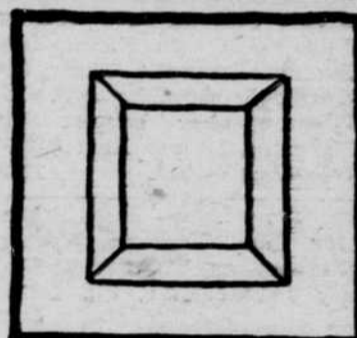

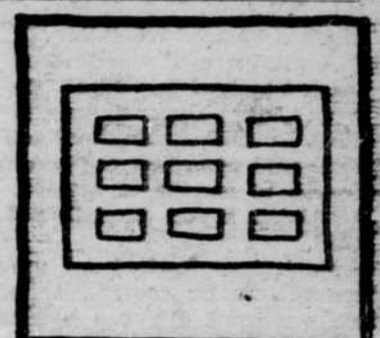

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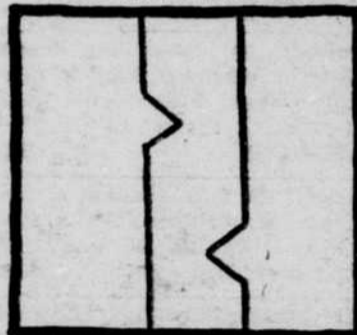
