LOS ANGELES-(AP)-The unbeaten Bruins of UCLA, as might have been expected, dominate the 1954 All-Pacific Coast conference football team as selected by the Associated Press.

Champion of the conference for the second straight year, UCLA placed four players on the AP first team and four more on the mythical second team.


There was no reluctance by the voters in placing two T-quarterbacks, Shaw and Larson, in the first team backfield.




