

# Oath Is Taken By Neuberger

WASHINGTON-(AP)-Richard L. Neuberger was sworn in Wednesday as U.S. senator, the first Democrat Oregon has elected to that position in 40 years.

Neuberger, 42, who upset veteran Republican Sen. Guy Cordon in last November's election, took the oath of office shortly after the 84th Congress convened at noon.

Neuberger was escorted by Sen. Morse (Ind-Ore) to the well of the Senate for the ceremony. He was one of 34 senators to take the oath from Vice President Nixon. Afterward, he signed a written oath and kept the pen as a souvenir.

Neuberger, whose election gave the Democrats control of the Senate, was given a desk at the extreme right of the rostrum.

Before the ceremony Neuberger told friends at his new senatorial offices a story about a remark by former Vice President Alben Barkley at Tuesday's Democratic caucus. He said Barkley, now a senator from Kentucky, joined him at the back of the room, declaring:

"Us freshmen have to stick together."
