Bricker Repeats Amendment Idea

WASHINGTON - (AP) - Sen. Bricker (R-Ohio), saying he hopes that President Eisenhower and he can agree this time, re-introduced his proposed constitutional amendment to limit treaty powers Thursday.

Last year the Senate spent a month on the amendment, defeating it in the end after the Eisenhower administration opposed it as a handicap on the President's handling of foreign affairs.

The amendment would declare that treaties would not be valid as domestic law within the United States unless federal or state governments passed special, appropriate legislation.

There has been no sign from the White House that the administration looks any more favorably on the idea than it did a year ago. For another thing, Sen. Kilgore (D-W.Va.) will be the new chairman of the Senate Judiciary committee and he may be in no mood to bring the amendment before the Senate. Kilgore voted against a milder form of Bricker's plan last January.
