McMINNVILLE-(AP)-Linfield college here announced Wednesday that in the event of an enemy attack on the Pacific Northwest, the college will be turned into an administrative center for the staff of the Oregon Civilian Defense Emergency Welfare service.

Dr. Harry L. Dillin, president, said the college would be the focal point for directing many welfare centers that would be set up in Northwest Oregon. McMinnville, 38 miles southwest of Portland, is considered by defense officials to be outside the probable damage area if Portland is attacked, Dillin explained.
