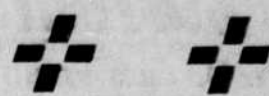

Langlie Suggests State Utilities Tax

OLYMPIA-(AP)-Gov. Langlie said Thursday a five per cent surcharge on the utilities tax would be the easiest and simplest way for the state to raise half the additional 41 million dollars it needs for the next two years.

He said he was not proposing the tax, but added:

"I like the utility tax from the standpoint that it is the easiest and least costly to collect and it interferes less, in my judgment, with the economy of the state."

The Governor discussed the utility tax at a news conference in which he expanded on his message to the 34th Legislature.

To clarify his position, Gov. Langlie said he does not favor an income tax or an increase in the sales tax. In connection with the former, however, Langlie said he felt the people should be entitled to vote on the question.
