Neuberger Charges 'Southerners' Betrayed

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senator Richard Neuberger delivered his first speech in the Senate Wednesday and said the administration's refusal to budget money for starting construction of the Talent irrigation project "constitutes a betrayal of the people of Southern Oregon."

"The people of Jackson county were sold a mirage for political purposes," he declared.

The Talent project, in the Rogue river basin, would develop storage to water 8640 acres of arid land and supplement the water supply for an additional 9250. The project, authorized by congress last summer with cost estimated at 23 million dollars, also would include a 16,000-kilowatt power plant.

The new senator said Oregon is one of the nation's fastest growing states and needs sound, steady development of its resources.
