

'Kiss Me, Kate' Chosen For Spring Production

"Kiss Me, Kate," a musical play by Sam and Bella Spewack with music by Cole Porter, will be the spring musical of the University theater, Horace Robinson announced Wednesday.

First readings for the play will be held Monday at 8 p.m. in 102 Villard. One additional afternoon tryout will be held next week. Casting will be made from those attending the tryouts, Robinson said. Those who cannot attend the tryouts are to see Robinson next week.

Robinson will direct the musical comedy, assisted by Max Risinger, assistant professor of music. Risinger will handle vocal direction of the chorus. Herman Gelhausen, associate professor of music, will coach the principals and Robert Cunningham, instructor in woodwinds, will direct the orchestra.

Monday's tryouts will be for

singing and dialog roles. Those trying out should be prepared to sing from the score or one of their own choosing.

Dance tryouts will be Tuesday evening at 7:30 on the main stage, according to Gloria Lee and John Jensen, both seniors in speech, who will choreograph the show.

They are scheduled to play in Great Falls, Montana after completing their present engagement. They then plan a return engagement in Hawaii.

Also performing at today's program will be Betsy Morphet, Judy Dunn and Louann Pearson, all freshmen in liberal arts, who will dance, and Ben Dorris freshman in liberal arts, who will play the piano.

Documentary Film To Appear at Rex
