

Mayfield Wins Pro Golf Playoff In Thunderbird

PALM SPRINGS, Calif. (AP)—Tall Shelley Mayfield won the \$15,000 Thunderbird Invitational Golf tournament Monday in a dramatic three-way extra-hole playoff.

The 30-year-old professional from Chicopee, Mass., won out in a sudden death duel on the 20th hole from husky Mike Souchak of Durham, N.C., after the third member of the playoff combination, Freddie Haas, Jr., of New Orleans bowed out on the 18th hole.

Gallery Thrilled

Mayfield and Souchak gave the gallery at the Thunderbird Country club a thrill on the two extra holes. On the 20th, Mayfield spanked an iron shot approach a little less than five feet away.

Souchak, a former Duke university football player and at 27 a sophomore on the tournament trail, faced a slanting green. The putt broke wrong and missed. Mayfield tapped his ball in for the win and picked up \$2000 to \$1000 for Souchak and \$750 for Haas.

Peewees Give Show at Half

One of the best halftime shows in recent years was a highlight of Friday night's Oregon-BYU game in McArthur court as the Lincoln Hotshots beat the Willard Vikings, 7-1, in a Eugene Boys Athletic association basketball exhibition.

The two small-fry teams, composed mostly of sixth-graders from two local elementary schools, provided a multitude of laughs for the 4700 fans attending the Varsity and Frosh games and kept them in their seats during the usual 15-minute intermission.

The two teams were representatives from the 33-team membership of the local boys association, which is sponsored by a group of Eugene businessmen to promote interest in grade school sports. The group also sponsors the Peewee Baseball league here in the summer.

The Hotshots and the Vikings played two six-minute halves in Friday's halftime show. The boys usually play on Saturday afternoon in regular league play with four six-minute quarters constituting a game. Most of the schools have more than one team with the association having A, B, and C divisions.

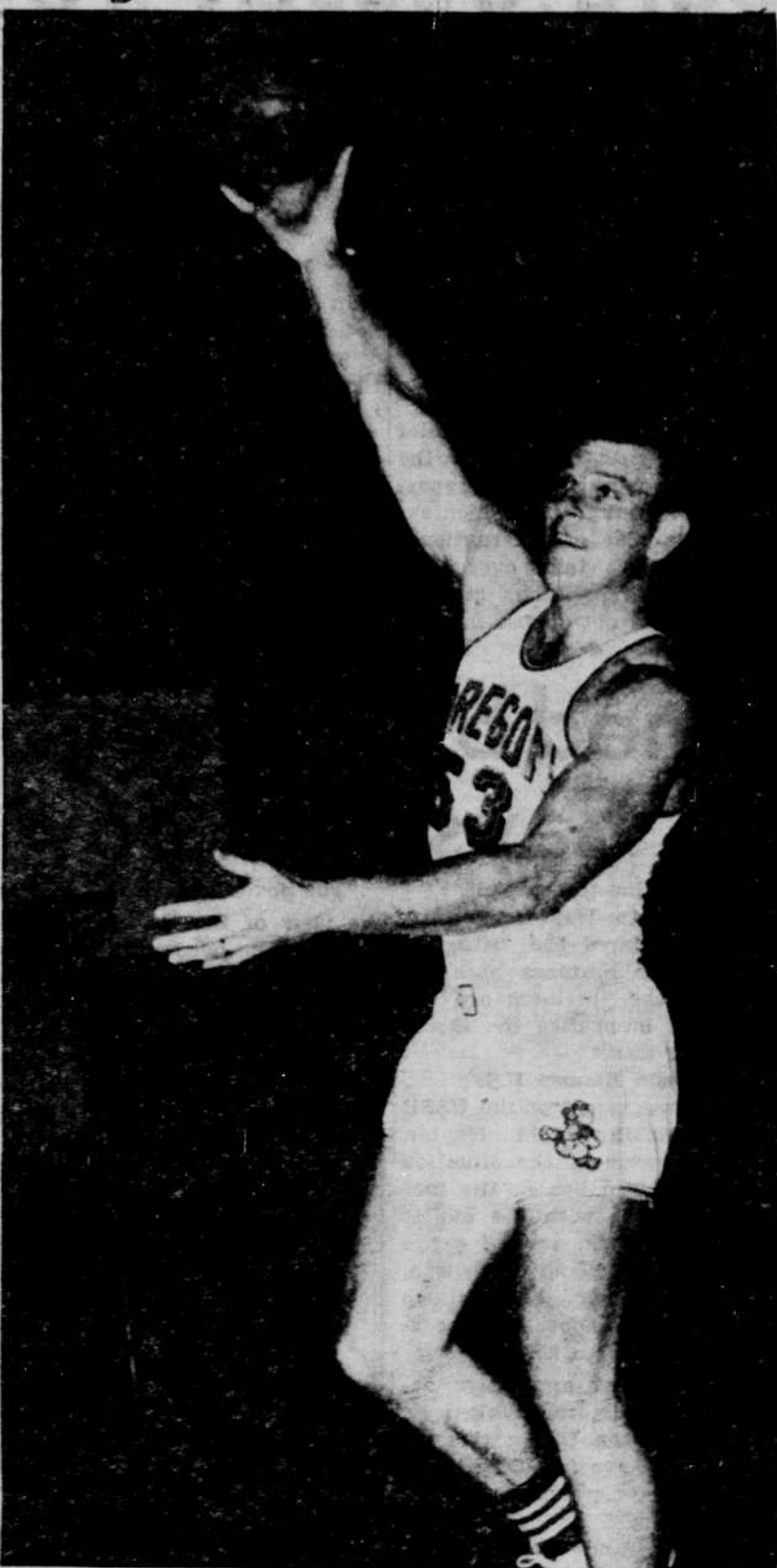

Kentucky, Dons Lead Hoop Poll

NEW YORK (AP)—The University of Kentucky Wildcats topped the Associated Press basketball poll Tuesday for the seventh straight week, but there are rumblings from the Far West as the University of San Francisco Dons are making a powerful challenge for the lead.

For the second straight week the Dons find themselves in second place, but this time it is too close for comfort for Kentucky.

This week a total of 122 ballots was cast, and Kentucky received 48 firsts compared with 33 for San Francisco. On the basis of 10 points for first, nine for second, etc., Kentucky received 1031 points and San Francisco 953.

The balloting was based on results of games through last

Saturday, and these two clubs were far ahead of any other team in the land.

Kentucky had a rough time Saturday before beating Vanderbilt 75-71, while San Francisco made it 12 straight by triumphing California 84-62 Saturday after disposing of Stanford Friday, 76-60.
