"We need to know what man believes," he said. "We must understand religious motivations and experiences in order to understand our world today. It is impossible to know a society without knowing the religious forces behind it.

"Our actions and beliefs today will extend into tomorrow. Today. has already been fashioned and we are forming the next generation."

This RE week program has shown a cross section of religious people can participate in an examination of religious values rather than simply re-stating their own doctrines, Staines said.


