"All those who sincerely work for peace regret this abrupt rejection of an invitation to come to the Security Council to consider the cessation of hostilities along the offshore islands. They regret also this further flouting of the United Nations which is so similar to previous Chinese Communist actions in Korea and

"It is for the Security Council, which is constantly striving for peace, to consider this rejection and we shall be consulting with other members toward a further meeting."
