SU Board Undecided On Commercial Concert

Whether the Student Union board should sponsor a special event presented by a commercial organization was the prominent question before the board at the Wednesday meeting.

The proposal which brought about this question was the request of the Hammond Organ Society of Eugene that the SU Board sponsor a concert by organist Ethel Smith. The concert would be held in Mac court. The society wished the sponsorship of the board as it could not obtain rental services without it. The Organ Society would pay all expenses of the concert and the only contribution of the board would be that of its sponsorship.

The proceeds of the concert would go as scholarships to organ students within the Eugene area. University students would be admitted free to the concert. The board decided to investigate further before giving its final decision.

The board voted to sponsor five dances to be held for high

school students during the high school basketball tournament March 14-19. It will also waive the university students' priority in the SU recreational area during that week.
