Veterans still interested in changing their major college program are reminded that such changes cannot be made later than three years from the student's date of separation.

Counseling service is still available to veterans, even after they have enrolled in school. Those who are still uncertain about aptitudes, abilities, or objectives should apply for guidance through the VA.

Seriously disabled veterans are still eligible for a \$1600 grant towards a car. The application for such a grant must be made within three years of separation from the armed forces.

Veterans are also reminded that under certain conditions they are eligible for hospitalization at the VA hospital even though the medical condition is not a service-connected disability.
