Pat Leonard was finalist in the Air Force unit's contest, and will be a lieutenant colonel. Other finalists for both units will be majors, according to Bob Arndt, chairman of Little Colonel selection.

All eight of the finalists will be present at reviews and award ceremonies for the rest of the year, and will be present when commissions are awarded during graduation ceremonies, Arndt said.

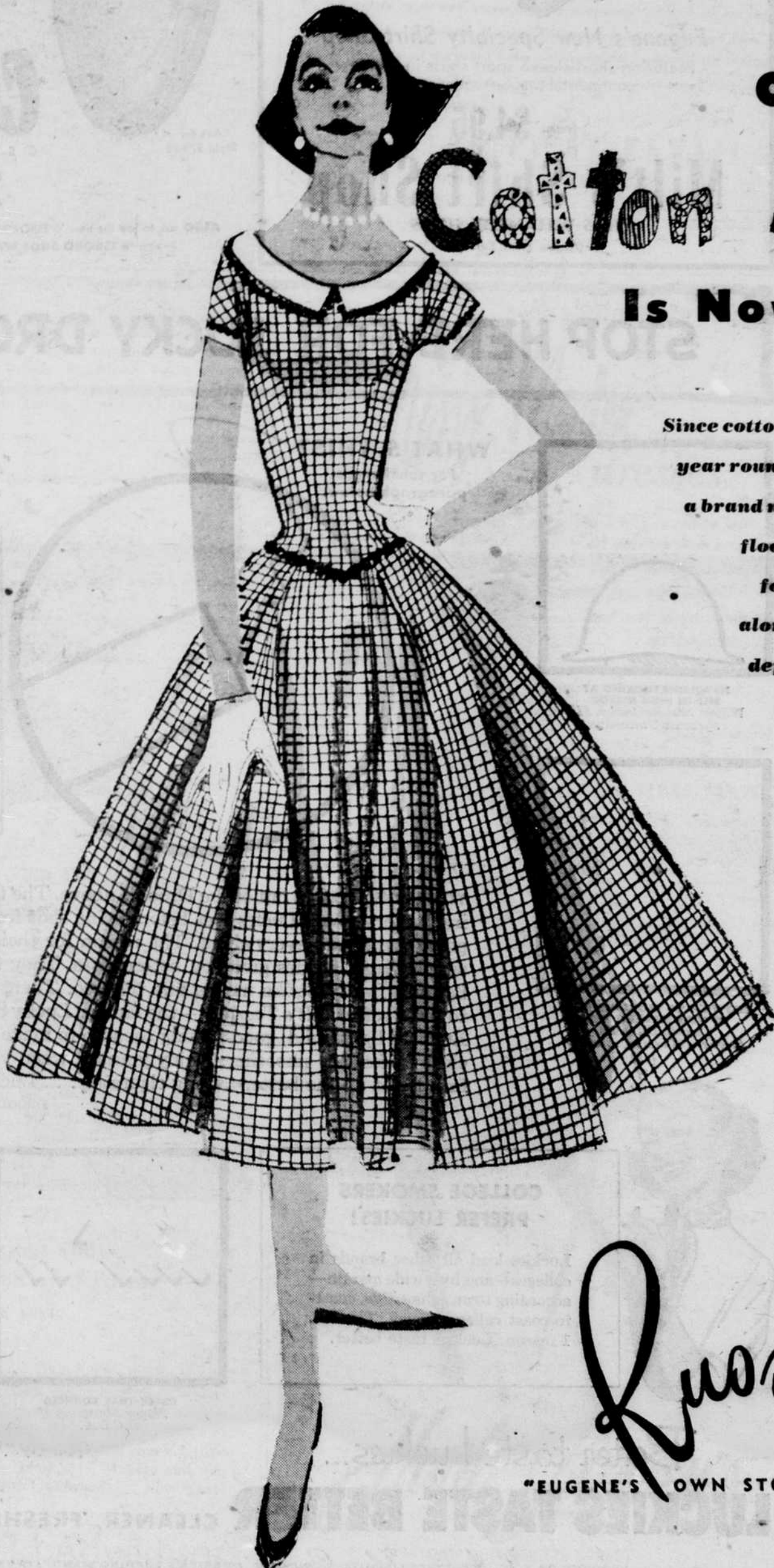
