

Hosteling May Solve Vacation-Time Plans

For students who have not yet made their summer vacation plans, hosteling may be the answer. Hosteling is also the answer for those who need to travel on a budget and who enjoy something unique in the way of travel.

"To see twice the country for half the price" is the aim of the low-budget vacation programs sponsored by the American Youth Hostels, Inc., headquarters at 14 West 8th Street in New York City.

The AYH is a 21-year-old non-profit, non-sectarian organization which has devoted itself to the development of inexpensive, educational and recreational travel in the United States and abroad. It sponsors trips, primarily by bicycle, throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, Mexico, Hawaii and Alaska.

Although most of the traveling is done on bicycles, long distances are covered by train, plane, boat or bus to allow for more time in areas of particular interest.

A hostel group usually consists of about 10 members with a competent leader, who travel from 30 to 50 miles a day by bike and stop over night in youth hostels. The hostels, operated by house parents, may range from a barn to a castle in the Riviera. AYH hostel groups often do their own cooking, permitting them to travel on extremely low budgets, as low as \$2 a day.

European excursions include 11-week tours of all parts of the continent, plus several "4-Week Specials." The "4-Week Specials" are geared for those who want to learn how to travel in a foreign country and then have a few weeks for independent travel.

Ideal for students are the AYH college-on-wheels trips. The itinerary for these trips includes approximately two days on land with 17 days of free time in Europe. Groups sail February 28 from New York to a Southern European port. Return voyage is from a Northern European port in late June.

Almost anyone is qualified to take the AYH hostel trips, the only requirement being that a person must be ready to spend the summer travelling simply, living ruggedly and "be willing to do your part to make the trips successful." The tours will be conducted this summer by the Ford Abroad Society for young people all over the United States.

Headed by Tonny Nolles, who has spent many years in Europe, the tours will leave New York by boat.

The "North" tour through London, Amsterdam, Munich, Venice, Rome and Paris will leave New York June 8 for Southampton, England. Students will spend 48 days in Europe, seeing not only the scenic attractions of the continent, but also enjoying the evening entertainment as well.

The Latin Quarter, Sarbonne, and the Riviera are only a few of the places to be visited.

The second, or "Mediterranean," tour leaves New York

June 30 for a more extensive visit to Europe. This tour lasts 56 days and covers Spain, Italy, Germany, Switzerland and France.

An interesting and unusual feature of the tour is the manner of travel through the European countries. Popular and roomy automobiles, called the Ford-Anglia, are to be provided for students throughout the trip. The English-built cars have American-type shifting, two doors and seat four passengers.
