The University Theater will present "Blood Wedding," a poetic drama by Federico Garcia Lorca, as a bonus attraction for its season ticket holders Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

This production is being handled by Helen Watson Adams, graduate in speech, as work towards her master's degree.

Miss Adams has chosen the play, designed the setting, cast the actors, and is directing the production as well as handling the promotion and ticket sales. This will be the first time the University Theater has presented
