Pierre Van Rysselberghe, professor of chemistry; William D. Clark, Curtis Borchers and Mark Bealor, all graduates in chemistry, and R. D. McCoy, resident fellow in chemistry, have been in Cincinnati the past week attending meetings of the American Chemical society.

Bealor has already arrived home, traveling by plane, and the others are expected to return the first of next week.

Michigan Professor To Speak at Assembly

Robert Hall, professor of geography and director of the University of Michigan center for Japanese studies, will be the University Assembly speaker April 26.

Hall is author of 42 books and articles, of which 22 pertain to the Far East area. His chief interests are in foreign area research and cultural geography of the Far East, particularly Japan.

He received his A.B., M.A. and Ph.D. degrees at the University of Michigan, the latter being received in 1927.

He has made field trips as director of geographic expeditions to the Republic of Haiti and in 1924 and 1925, and has been director of field expeditions to Japan in 1928, 1931, 1933 and 1935-56. He has also made five trips to Japan since World War II.

During World War I he was a combat intelligence officer, and in World War II he was director of the Pacific Coast office of the Office of Strategic Services. He

served in China and India in 1943 and 1944.

A member of Phi Beta Kappa, he has belonged to many research and geographical societies. He is currently a member of the board of directors of the Human Relations Area Files, Inc.

Law School Plans Traffic Conference

The fourth traffic court conference, sponsored by the law school and the general extension division of the state system of higher education, will be held at Fenton hall April 18, 19 and 20.

The conference will be attended by municipal judges, justices of the peace and police officers from all over the state of Oregon.

The conference will center around the enforcement of traffic laws. Addresses and demonstrations concerning the subject will be presented.

Coffee Hour Series Features Students

Jack Pierce, graduate in anthropology, will be the first speaker in a newly-planned coffee hour series starting tonight at 7:30 in the Student Union browsing room.

The series is intended to feature the lectures of students. The subject of the first talk will be "Homeostasis and Hokum." ulate a Buddhist temple interior. An image of the Buddhist messiah, Maitraya, whose coming to bring salvation to the faithful is scheduled for 5,670,000,000 years after Gautama's birthday, occupies a lower position in front of the image of Gautama.

Two Flanking Images

Flanking the image of Gautama will be sculptured representations of Analokitishvara, (Kannan) a reincarnation of the Buddhist who renounced his own experienced good deeds for the benefit of weaker souls anxious to get to Nirvana, the Buddhist Heaven.

One of these images was created almost 1000 years ago, and the other about 500 years ago. These images will appear in much the same way as they would in a Japanese temple, lighted from below, as though from candles set on the altar table. The two latter images were purchased by Harada for Mrs. Gertrude Bess Warner, the donor-director of the museum during her lifetime.
