Opening today at the McDonald Theater is the movie version of "A Man Called Peter," based on Catherine Marshall's best selling biography, which recalls her husband's outstanding career as a minister.

The technicolor feature traces Peter Marshall's life from Scotland where he grew up and became a mining worker to Washington, D.C., where he was the chaplain of the senate and pastor of the New York Avenue Presbyterian church.

Dr. Marshall, who died at the height of his career, was deeply respected by everyone in Washington, D.C., from the White House page boys to the President of the United States. The movie manages to catch his charm and striking personality which made him one of America's greatest clergymen.

Playing the leading role of Dr. Marshall in "A Man Called Peter," is Richard Todd. Jean Peters co-stars as his wife, Catherine. A few tears are guaranteed to those who enjoy a good cry. The second feature is "The Bob Mathias Story," starring Bob Mathias, which depicts his triumphs as an outstanding athlete.

Continuing at the Heilig theater through Saturday is "Hit the Deck," a bright musical comedy about the adventures of two sailors on leave, and its companion feature "Desperate Search," a story of three desperate people.

"Captain Lightfoot," another Rock Hudson-Barbara Rush epic, and "Rogues March" open Sunday at the Heilig. "Captain Lightfoot," is a technicolor, 19th century, Irish adventure filmed in Ireland and is sure to be full of adventure, romance, and colorful scenery plus having a creditable story based on the novel by W. R. Burnett.

Walt Disney is well represented this weekend in Eugene by his Academy Award winning technicolor production of "20,000 Leagues Under the Sea," starring Kirk Douglas and James

Mason at the Mayflower and his two nature triumphs "The Vanishing Prairie" and "The Living Desert" opening Sunday at the Rex.

Oscar winner, Grace Kelly, may be seen in her award winning role in "Country Girl" at the McKenzie. An old favorite, "The Egg and I," where Ma and Pa Kettle were first introduced, is the co-feature.
