

Church History Talk Scheduled

A conference of church history will be held here April 16-20, with Harold J. Grimm, chairman of the department of history at Indiana university, as the keynote speaker.

All conference sessions will be held in the Student Union. Grimm is also scheduled to speak in several Eugene churches. Delegates will be welcomed to the meeting by O. Meredith Wilson, University president.

Grimm is author of three history books and has been American editor of German written

international journal since 1951. He has also written numerous magazine articles. He became chairman of Indiana's history department in September of 1954.

Washington Profs Disapprove of Ban

The University of Washington Faculty Senate voted 56-40 to disapprove the ban against J. Robert Oppenheimer, the atomic scientist who will be on the Oregon campus sometime this month.

The Senate, an advisory group, censured University President Henry Schmitz for not allowing the scientist to visit the Washington campus.

The Senate members added, however, that they believed Schmitz was eager to "support the right of the faculty to think, to teach, to speak and write as they see fit."

In return, Schmitz said he would continue to work closely with the university administration and faculty.
