BUDAPEST, Hungary (AP) Hungary's Communist Party announced Monday it has fired Premier Imre Nagy from his top government job and stripped him of all his party posts.

The purging of the 58-year-old government chief had been expected since the party's Central Committee five weeks ago accused him of "right wing deviationism."

He had been the spokesman in Hungary for the "new look" emphasis on consumer goods production which the Communist countries abandoned with the demotion of Georgi Malenkov from the Soviet premiership.

Einstein Dies

PRINCETON, N.J. (AP)-Albert Einstein, who became internationally famous at 26 for his theory of relativity, died today after a four-day ill-

The 76-year-old world-acclaimed scientist died at Princeton Hospital at 1:15 a.m. of inflation of the gall bladder. A man who shunned publicity, he had entered the hospital Friday with only his intimates knowing he was ill.

Oppenheimer is a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, American Physics society, and a member of the National Academy of Sciences, American Philosophical Society.

Oppenheimer will repeat his two lectures at OSC on April 26 and 28 and at Portland State college on May 3 and 4.
