Air to Drill For Army

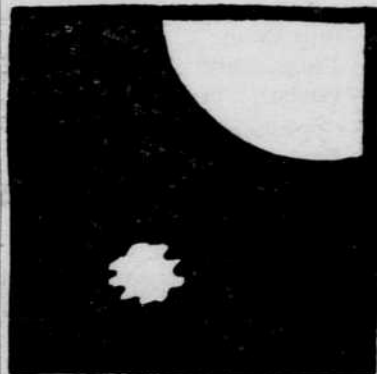
Air force ROTC units will pass in review for the army cadet regimental staff at drill this afternoon.
