Phi Theta, Kwama Petitions Due Now

Petitions are due today at 5 p.m. for membership in both Kwama, sophomore women's honorary, and Phi Theta Upsilon, junior women's honorary.

Kwama petitions must be accompanied by a photograph, and petitioners must have a minimum winter GPA of 2.0 and a 2.0 cumulative GPA. Thirty new members will be tapped.

The Kwama petitions should

be given to Helen Ruth Johnson at Chi Omega; Shirley Bostad, Carson 2, or any current Kwama member.

Phi Theta Upsilon petitioners must have a 2.4 minimum GPA, and must complete 80 credit hours by the end of the current term. Eighty hours up to winter term are not required, as was previously announced.
