Red China's Premier Chou En-Lai gave a boost to hopes for a peaceful Far East settlement last week, then dashed them somewhat Sunday.

When Senators Lowell Steen, Milton-Freewater, and Philip S. Lowry, Medford, carried the fight against the bill, the Senate turned down two motions to send the bill back to committee.

The sales tax proponents argued that a sales tax levy is needed to keep the income tax from soaring too high.

Sen. Rudie Wilhelm, Portland, Senate tax chairman, promised that if the House passes the sales tax, his committee would send it to the Senate floor for action. But he said he could not promise what the committee would recommend.
