Both the Ducks and Beavers are short on veterans, with Oregon boasting four one-year lettermen and Oregon State having two. The Ducks have a juniordominated lineup and OSC has two juniors plus two sophomores on their first five.

Last season Oregon State defeated the Ducks twice in dual competition, but the loss of four seniors from the Beaver team plus the return of four men from Oregon's 1954 team makes the match shape up as a toss-up.

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP) John Holman, a 5-1 underdog, launched a vicious surprise attack in the ninth round Wednesday night to stop Ezzard Charles, former world heavyweight champion, on a technical knockout.

Charles, who had gone down once for a nine count, was reeling helplessly away from Holman when referee Eddie Coachman stopped the fight at 2:48 of the ninth round. Until then, the 33-year-old ex-champion had been leading on points.

Nails Charles




