Joshua Whatmough Speaks in Dad's Room

Language, like life is a continually emerging, evolving pattern. Joshua Whatmough told a Dads' Room audience Thursday night.

Language is the most orderly form of human behavior, he said. We have a definite obligation to use words in a certain way, not as characterized by propaganda or moronic broadcasting. "Good order in language may be a cure for the mass neuroses of our times," he said.

All language is symbolism, and has to be interpreted. Whatmough stressed. It is characteristic of symbols that they are conventional rather than arbitrary, he said.

Tickets Available for Ballet Show

Tickets are still available for both the matinee and evening performances of the Ballet Society of Portland which will be held at the University Theater April 30.

Two performances are planned at the Theater, one to be given at 2:30 p.m. for grade and high school students and one at 8 p.m. for adults. University students will be included in the students' matinee rate of 50 cents; adult tickets will be sold at \$1. University Theater season ticket holders will be admitted to the evening performance for only \$1, all other tickets will sell at \$1.50.

This will be the first performance of the Ballet Society outside of Portland. The group,

which is made up of dance students from various studios in Portland and the Northwest, is directed by Jacqueline Martin Schumacher, ballet mistress of Richard Billings School of Dancing in Portland and former classical ballerina with the San Francisco Opera Ballet.

Nicholas Vasilieff, guest choreographer for the Society, has his own dance school and was formerly with the San Francisco company. Vasilieff was a soloist with the Ballet Theater and Ballet Caravan.
