Swedish Blonde Found Dead in LA

LOS ANGELES (AP) - A Swedish blonde bookeeper, daughter of a Stockholm building contractor, was found dead in her apartment Saturday. Police said after an autopsy Sunday that death was due to an air embolism apparently caused by an attempted abortion.

The victim was Miss Birgit Johansson, 25. Last Dec. 12, the Stockholm newspaper Aftonbladet said Miss Johansson would marry Mal Whitfield, U.S. Negro track star.

Whitfield denied it, and after that Miss Johansson said the report was due to a misunderstanding.

Whitfield's brother-in-law, Horace P. Clark, said the runner left three days ago for a track meet in Trinidad. Clark said Miss Johansson and the twotime Olympic 800-meter champion met during the 1952 Olympics in Europe but that they never dated.

Police said nothing has been found in the case to involve Whitfield.

Detective Sgt. E. V. Jackson said a friend of Miss Johansson, identified as Sam Lanier, 25, found her dead when he visited her flat. Detective Sgt. Herman Zander said Lanier, who was questioned and released, told officers he had known her about two months.

She was employed by a Hollywood bank and was a kindergarten teacher in Stockholm before coming to the United States.

The county coroner's chief autopsy surgeon, Dr. Frederick D. Newbarr, performed the postmortem. He said she was "five to six months pregnant."

Other sub-committee chairmen will be chosen later through petitions.


Reading Lists Due Thursday
