NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market wavered Wednesday between a lower and a higher trend, but at the close it was slightly higher. Most price changes were quite narrow, but the range ran from around three points lower to two points higher.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks gained 20 cents. It was down \$1.80 Tuesday. All three components of the average were up 20 cents each.

Volume was moderate at 2,206,000 shares. That compares with 2,630,000 shares traded Tuesday.
