

Ducklings Split With Clark JC Netmen Score Double Win; Golfers Lose, Then Triumph

Fresh from a weekend in which they clubbed out 31 hits and amassed 23 runs in two games, Oregon's fired-up Frosh travel to Corvallis today for a return bout with the Oregon State Rooks.

The Ducklings collected 18 hits to 10 for Clark JC on Friday, but fell to the Penguins 16-12 in a marathon that lasted three and a half hours. On Saturday the Frosh bounced back to lash the visitors 11-4 and bang out 13 more safeties.

The Frosh opened their season last Thursday with a 7-6 win over the Rooks.

Pifher Slugs

Shortstop Jim Pifher led the Ducklings on their hitting spree, getting four for five on Friday and three for three the next day. Two of his clouts were for four bases.

The Penguins iced a 13-11 ball game in the ninth inning Friday by collecting three runs off four walks, a single, and a steal of home.

Don Welbon went the distance on Saturday, allowing twelve scattered hits, while his mates were ganging up on Penguin pitching in the third and eighth innings. The Ducklings got three runs in the third and four in the big eighth.

Pifher and centerfielder Dick Jarvis homered in the Duckling cause, and Jarvis, thirdbasemen Bob Cellers, catcher Ron Dodge and firstbaseman Dave Wanaka all slammed two hits.

After their game today, the Ducklings will scrimmage Eugene high on Thursday before taking on the Rooks again in a
