Mental Tests Set For Naval Flying

Mental tests for men interested in naval flight . training will be given tonight and tomorrow night at 6:30 p.m. in Commonwealth 172.

The tests will last for approximately three hours, and applicants will know the results immediately after taking them.

The men administering the tests will be available in the Student Union all day both days, and may be contacted through the administration office.

Men who pass the tests will be eligible to take the physical examination, to be given in Beattle, and to file an application for naval flight training. They will not be obligated until their orders come through, however.

One category, that for single men between the ages of 18 and 25, requires a minimum of 90 University hours completed. These men will then take a 16week pre-flight training, and 14 months of flight training, following which they will be commissioned.

University graduates may be married, and will be commissioned following their pre-flight training. They will receive the flight transing as commissoned officers.


