He was head of the department of political science originally, and in July, 1947, he received the double appointment as deanof the liberal arts and graduate schools, which position he has held since.

He was acting director of the 1946 summer session.

Born in Indiana

Johnson was born in Indiana and educated at the Indiana State Teachers college. He received his Ph.D. at the University of Wisconsin, in 1939.

He has devoted his entire career to the field of education, serving as a teaching assistant and fellow in the University of Wisconsin's political science department following his gradua-


