Rather than accepting the problem for full credit or turning it back to the student for further development, a practice has evolved in which the problem, is often accepted for less credit, thus becoming a grading system in terms of credit hours.

**Industrialists Find Area 'Attractive'**

Industrialists are finding the Northwest "very attractive," and this interest will continue to grow as long as the regional market continues to increase. The present trend is to establish industries near the markets.

This opinion was expressed by Harvey S. Perloff, director of the program of education and research in planning at the University of Chicago, while he was on campus Tuesday and Thursday.

Perloff predicted that international trade on the West Coast will pick up as Far Eastern countries build up their production and trade. This will bring more industries. However, they have been reluctant to locate here for national trade because of transportation problems, he claimed.

"Power is important, but power alone is not enough to attract industries now," Perloff said. "Being near a good market is more important."

Other factors are considered, too. The Hyde Park-Kenwood Community conference, composed of about 100 block committees in Chicago, has been successful, Perloff believes. The res-

idents in these blocks discuss urban problems pertaining to them and then act upon their decisions. He then added that he thought this group is one of the best in the nation and that it has had a lot of influence in the city of Chicago and the surrounding areas.
