his repentant son with a feast of the fatted calf. This meal is memorable as it is served in the manner of a modern Western barbecue.

Production wise this film makes "Quo Vadis" look like a low budget Republican western. "The Prodigal" has 11,000 properties, 4000 costumes, 400,000 square feet of outdoor sets, four of the world's largest indoor sound stages, multitudes of actors, and extraordinary make-up including Lana Turner's nails being painted with 22-carat gold leaf.

Balance at the Rex

"Mr. Hulot's Holiday," which is mostly pantomime, and "Tony Draws a Horse," which is all talk, now at the Rex, is a perfectly balanced program. Mr. Hulot spends a delightful and eventful summer in a French resort, without speaking a word. All of the other guests are skillful caricatures of resort dwellers.

A lady psychiatrist is the center of "Tony Draws a Horse." This lady goes on a "self-expression binge" to France with her sister's future husband. The psychiatrist's jilted husband fumes, her mother is flabbergasted, her sister is heart-broken, her grandfather continues to drink and eat, and her son draws nasty pictures.

In addition her father gets drunk and is arrested. This simple plot is unfolded in a typically English manner. Both of these English films are excellent entertainment.

"Strategic Air Command," now at the Heilig, should have been named "All About Air-

planes." It goes into spectacular detail concerning the workings of airplanes. Tying this flying lesson, together is a sentimentally sticky story about a star baseball player (James Stewart) of the reserves who answers the call of duty.

Of course, he must sacrifice his career, but with his slobbering all-American wife (June Allyson) standing beside him, hisiping her clinches, he makes the decision to serve his country. Ignoring the trite story, the film is excellent in regard to the information about airplanes.

McGoo Returns

Mr. McGoo fans should be at the Firs Sunday for the "McGoo Merry-Go-Round," a series of cartoons depicting the bizarre adventures of this famous little man. In addition Judy Garland's tragic attempt at tragedy, "A Star Is Born," is playing.

"Broken Lance," which won the Oscar for the best original screen play, starts Sunday at the Eugene Drive-In. Featuring Spencer Tracy and Robert Wagner, this is an exciting epic of Texas cattle ranching and a careful portrayal of the men and women who made up this area's awe-abundant era.

"Sabrina," which starts Sunday at the Motor-Vu Drive-In, is an inspirational story of a chauffeur's daughter (Audrey Hepburn), who after a great deal of work, catches herself a rich but not young, husband (Humphrey Bogart). Sabrina mercilessly spurns the love of playboy William Holden.
