**Emerald Associate Editor** Approval of two Millrace proposals to start the process of restoration of the 'Race highlighted actions of the ASUO Senate in their last spring term meeting Tuesday night.

The proposals were for Senate approval of the appropriation of money from the Millrace Restoration fund for an engineering survey of the 'Race to be completed this summer. The survey would give specific recommendations on how to create a minimum satisfactory sanitary flow in the Millrace.
