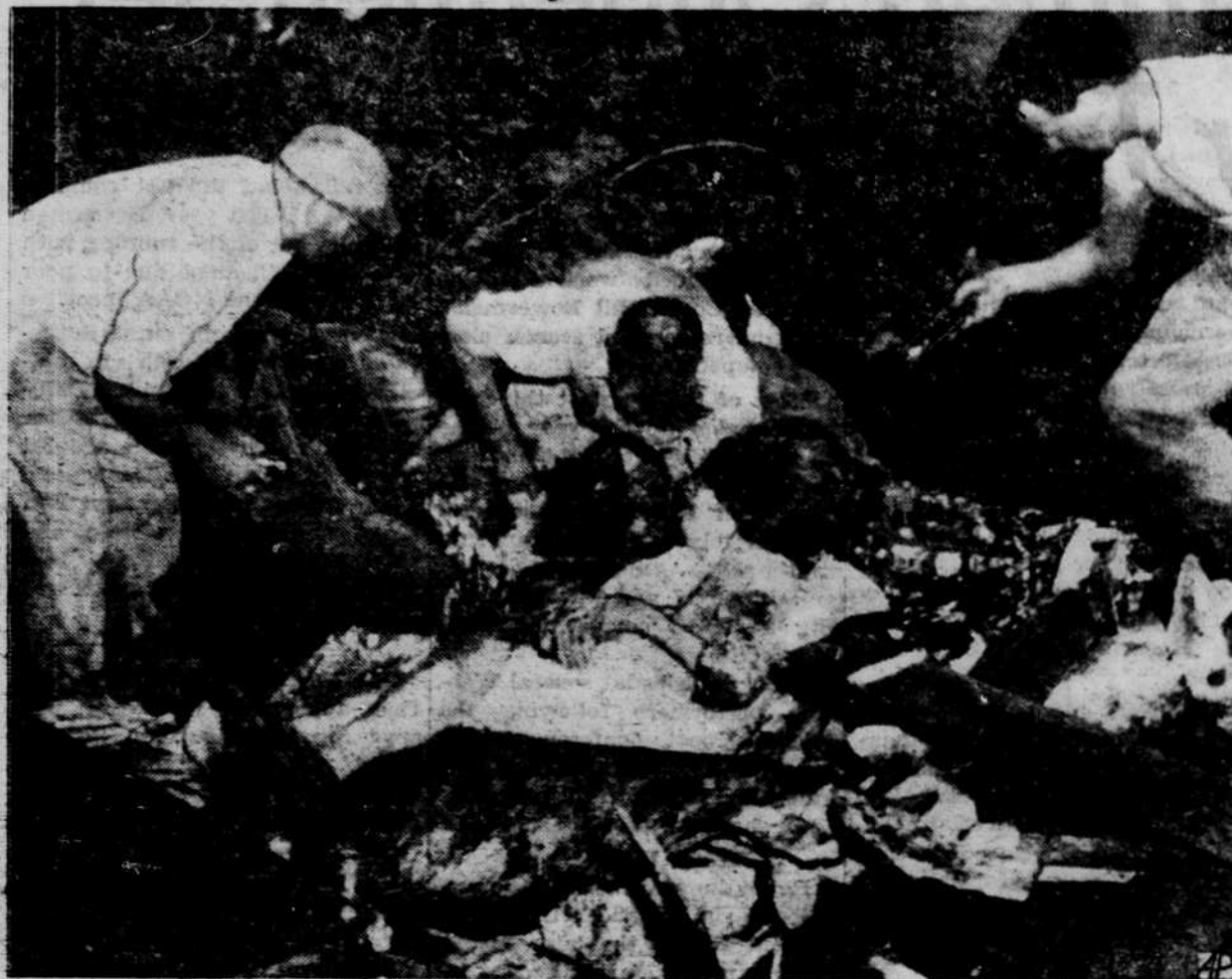


Tornado Injures Victims...

UO Professor's Book of Proverbs Published by Stanford Press

A book of German proverbs and proverbial phrases by Edmund P. Kremer, professor of Germanic languages, has been published recently by the Stanford University press.

The book, which Kremer has been preparing for the last 12 years, includes more than 1500 German language proverbs reflecting that country's daily life. The work is entitled "German Proverbs: And Proverbial Phrases with their English Counterparts."

Kremer believes these proverbs will "help foster an appreciation of the language and culture" of Germany.

A native of Germany, the author has been on the University staff since 1928. He received a doctor of laws degree at the Uni-

versity of Frankfurt-on-Main in 1924. He is also author of the "German-American Handbook" and several other books.
