Marquis, Lovell To Attend Meet

Lucian Marquis, instructor in political science, and Hugh Lovell, head of the labor and business programs at Portland State college's evening sessions, have made all the arrangements for the third annual Institute on Management in Government and Business which will be held at the Columbia Athletic club in Portland, June 14.

The department of political science here and the general extension division of the state system of higher education are sponsoring the institute.

Speakers include Edwin Nourse, former chairman of the President's Council of Economic advisers; and Wesley Ballaine, professor, and Charles Ziebarth, associate professor, both of the school of business administration.

The program, "Management and the Region," is designed to give local executives a single, integrated picture of business and economic trends affecting the Portland area. Factual material will be presented on some of the long-range economic trends affecting the Portland area, the state and the northwest region. Among subjects to be discussed will be population changes, latest developments in transportation, power and forest products industries.
