

Schedule Listed For School Year

The academic schedule has recently been announced for 1955-56. Fall term registration will be held Sept. 21-24. Fees must be paid by noon Saturday, Sept. 24. Classes will begin Monday, Sept. 26. Monday, Oct. 10 is the last day to register or freely change courses. Saturday, Oct. 1 and Saturday, Oct. 15 are holidays, due to football games in Portland on those dates. University Charter Day will be Tuesday, Oct. 18. Thanksgiving vacation will be Thursday, Nov. 24 through Sunday, Nov. 27. Preliminary advising conferences for winter term will be held Tuesday, Nov. 29. Final examinations for fall term will be Wednesday, Dec. 14 through Tuesday, Dec. 20.

Winter Term

Registration for winter term will be Tuesday, Jan. 3, with classes beginning on Wednesday, Jan. 4. Saturday, Jan. 7 is the last day to pay fees without penalty. The last day to register or change courses is Monday, Jan. 16.

Preliminary advising conferences for spring term will be held on Tuesday, Feb. 28. Final examinations for winter term will be

Monday, March 12 through Saturday, March 17.

Spring Term

Spring term registration will be March 26, with classes beginning the following day. Fees must be paid by Saturday noon, March 31. Monday, April 9, is the last day to register or freely change courses. There will be no classes on Memorial Day, Wednesday, May 30. Final examinations will be Monday, June 4, through Saturday, June 9.

Band, Choral Activities Open for All Students

Music school activities, which include band, chorus and orchestra, are open to all students on campus and one term-hour's credit may be obtained from participation in each.

Students interested in band should contact R. S. Wagner, director, in Music building 111, or assistant director I. D. Lee, old music building 104.

High school band experience will be considered in making selections, with tryouts to be held in some instances. Students interested should contact the directors before September 23.

Included under choral groups are the Choral Union, University Singers and Madrigal Singers.

The choral union will present Mozart's "Requiem" in connection with the Mozart Festival, during winter and spring terms.

Previous experience with high-school choral work is enrollment requirement. Non-music majors should contact M. D. Risinger, Music 112 before registering.

The University Singers is a concert group, which will present concerts both on and off campus, as well as hold an annual tour. Auditions are membership prerequisite, and Risinger should be contacted.

Madrigal Singers is a small ensemble which performs madrigals and folk songs. Risinger is also in charge of this group.

The orchestra and other smaller ensembles are open to qualified students. Director is George Boughton, Music 204.
