Against this formidable array, Oregon will throw a fast, aggressive line and one of the finest running backfields seen in Eugene for years.

Guard Spike Hillstrom led the Duck defense against Washington, and the 197-pound junior is sure to be in there at the opening kickoff, Two sophomores, Center Norm Chapman and Tackle John Raventos, showed lots of hustling line play in the Husky game, as did Jack Pocock and Captain Lon Stiner.
