Oregon Sisters Study In Paris and Madrid

The urge to study abroad led two sisters, Diane and Carol David, both students at the University of Oregon, to spend a year abroad studying in Europe.

Diane, who graduated last year, spent her junior year in Paris on a Sweet Briar scholarship. After finishing her senior year here she returned to Paris, this time on a scholarship awarded by the French government.

She will live at Fayer International while working toward a master's degree in Art.

Carol, who is a senior now, has just returned from a year of study in Spain. She went in conjunction with Smith College's Junior Year in Spain plan.

There were ten other students that went to Spain in her group, nine girls and one boy.

They lived with non-English speaking families almost the entire time they were there and had little outside contact with other Americans.

The group lived in Madrid and took courses at the University there which were all in Spanish. Carol took a general liberal arts course with emphasis on art.

Whenever they could take time out from their studies they made excursions through many parts of Spain. Carol enjoyed most the Island of Majorca which is situated off the coast of Spain.

Before coming back to the States she made a trip to Italy and while visiting the Isle of Capri missed her boat and so was separated from her group.

Not knowing the language made it quite difficult for her but she found the Italian people very helpful. "Once they found out I didn't speak Italian they began to treat me as if I were one of their own children," remarked Carol.

Concerning the Spanish themselves Carol feels that although their basic ideals are similar to ours, externally they appear to be exactly the opposite.

Carol found that the greatest value of her trip was the friendships she made with both the American students she studied with and the few Spanish people who became her close friends.

Carol has been quite active in campus affairs and is a member of Delta Gamma as was her sister Diane, who was a counselor at Susan Campbell last year.
