Printed Classics to Be Given Top Essays in Coming Contest

Ten printed classics will be awarded to the University of Oregon undergraduate who submits the best essay on any of a group of suggested topics of his own choosing. A second prize of five classics will be given to the student submitting the second best essay.

The books will be selected by the winners from the Peter Pauper "Collector's Editions," awarded to the University of Oregon library in 1950. The books represent a collection of outstanding bookmaking and outstanding literature.

Prizes will be awarded annually at the All Campus Sing, Junior week end. Essays will be judged by the University of Oregon librarian and two faculty members.

'Impressario' Parts Are Still Available

The tenor, baritone, and speaking parts are still open for Mozart's "The Impresario," to be presented at the University Theatre in February. Anyone wishing to audition for any of these parts should contact Mr. Gelhausen, school of music, ext. 521, immediately.

Some suggested topics are: Great Editions of Great Books, The Nature of a Classic, The Collecting of a Student's Library, What the Classics Mean to Me, and Reading for Leisure Moments.

Rules governing the contest are: Any undergraduate student enrolled in the University of Oregon, for a full course of studies will be eligible to compete.

Any student wishing to compete in the contest must declare an intent to participate by Feb. 1 of each school year to Miss Bernice Rise, browsing room librarian in the browsing room of

the Erb Memorial Student Union.

The contestant must submit only one essay. Essays may not exceed 2,000 words.

Essays must be legibly written in ink or preferably typewritten, double-spaced, have wide margins and be on one side of the paper, 8½x11 inches in size.

Each essay must bear the name and campus address of the student. The sheets must be numbered consecutively and be securely tied together.

All direct quotations must be enclosed in quotation marks and due credit must be given to sources of reference. Books referred to in the essay must have been read by the contestant during the school year.

All essays must be submitted to Dr. Carl W. Hintz, University librarian, or to Miss Rise, in the browsing room, by May of each school year.
