

Ducks Blank WSC, 35-0

Webfoots' Offense Overruns Cougars

Oregon turned a sunshiny homecoming day into a dreary, dismal afternoon for Washington State fans by handing the Cougars a 35-0 disaster Saturday in Pullman. Turning on their unstoppable speed, Len Casanova's boys romped for 329 yards on the ground and held WSC to a lackluster 67.

The Ducks scored twice in each of the first two periods and then added a fifth in the last stanza, while the hard-charging Webfoot line kept the Cougars from penetrating past the 20.

Fullback Jack Morris netted 95 yards in nine carries, scored the second touchdown on a 17-yard dash around end, and kicked four extra points to provide the largest of many sparks.

Only real Cougar threat was halted on the Oregon 25 when Jack Brown hauled down a Frank Sarno pass.

Oregon hit paydirt just after the six minute mark in the first quarter, Phil McHugh falling on a Dick James fumble in the end zone after James had cracked over from a yard out. The Ducks traveled 46 yards for their tally, with Jim Shanley doing most of the work.

The little North Bend sophomore boomed 29 and 18 yards through the bewildered Cougar defense. WSC held gamely for three downs, but on the fourth the always-alert McHugh grabbed the loose leather for six points. Morris' mechanical toe made it 7-0.

Six minutes later the Webfoot juggernaut crunched 55 yards in seven plays for a second score. This time it was Morris sprinting 17 yards for the touchdown and kicking the extra point.

Nick Markulis touched off the drive by recovering a fumble by sophomore halfback Rey Alvarado, touted line-smasher who gained only three net yards for the afternoon. After Morris had

gained one, Shanley took off on another breakaway dash to the 23.

Morris gained another three, and Tom Crabtree threw incomplete to Shanley. James picked up three more, and on fourth down Morris bolted around left end, and, with lots of sharp blocking to help out, charged into the end zone.

It didn't take the Ducks long to get rolling again after changing ends at the quarter. With two and a half minutes gone, James went off left tackle to make it 20-0, and Morris' third perfect boot made it 21.

The drive leading to the third touchdown went 78 yards, longest sustained march of the game, and it took the Webfoots just eight plays to go the distance.

Starting in the last seconds of the first quarter, the drive began on the Oregon 22 after Brown had returned a punt to the 45 and a clipping penalty pushed the Ducks deeper into their own territory than the Cougar offense had been able to do.

Brown ambled up to the 37, and Fred Miklancik, giving the hard-running Morris a well-earned rest, added six yards as the quarter came to an end.

Morris returned to the game and slashed for nine in his first

assignment, ending up on the WSC 48. James went for another nine yards. Then Tom Crabtree took to the air, tossing to End George Slender for seven yards and the first down.

Giving the ball to Shanley again proved a wise decision, as the diminutive fireball spurred for a twenty-yard spurt to the Cougar 12. Morris took a pitchout nine yards to the three, and James had no trouble bowling into the end zone. Morris made it three PAT's in a row.

Five clock-minutes later, the Ducks added a fourth touchdown that put the game completely out of the Cougars' grasp. Starting from the 50, to where Chuck Osborne had carried a punt return, Morris reversed, smashed, and simply sped his way 42 yards to the eight. A key block by Spike Hillstrom helped him on his way.

Jack Crabtree made five on a keeper play, and Morris was thrown for a three-yard loss before Brown smashed to the three. Crabtree flipped a short pass to Bill Tarrow, all alone in the end zone, for the score. Morris' kick was true, as usual.

No scoring was done in the third quarter, but it contained one of the most beautiful touchdown runs (although it was called back) seen all season. Shanley

gathered in a punt on his own six and flashed 96 yards, only to have a clipping penalty nullify his efforts.

Oregon drove 54 yards in seven plays to score in the waning seconds of the game, with Jack Crabtree at the helm all the way and going 4 yards for the TD on a quarterback sneak.

Coach Len Casanova was well-pleased with his team's first-half performance, but though the work of the reserves, who played

most of the second half, could have been better.

Following Morris in the rushing department were Shanley with 82 yards in six carries, Brown with 46 yards and James with 45. Leading Washington

State ground gainer was senior Jim Hagerty with 31 yards in 11 carries.

The win moved the surprising Ducks into a three-way tie for third place in the Coast conference with USC and Washington, all owning 3-2 records. Next for the Webfoots are the equally-surprising Stanford Indians, who knocked off Southern Cal's high-ranking Trojans, 28-20, Saturday. The Oregons should be in top physical shape for the Palo Alto tussle.
