

Grad Fellowships Available Abroad

Competition is now open for graduate scholarships and fellowships offered by foreign governments and universities to citizens of the United States for the 1956-57 academic year.

Awards are available for study, research or teaching in Ceylon, Colombia, Cuba, Denmark, The Netherlands, France, and Sweden.

In addition, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization is offering awards for study or research in NATO member countries. Most

awards cover room, board, and tuition fees for the academic year. Successful candidates for many of the awards will be eligible to apply for Fulbright travel grants.

Requirements to be considered for the scholarships include United States citizenship, a bachelor's degree and a good academic record, good moral character, personality and adaptability and good health. In most cases, knowledge of the language is also required.

Applications may be obtained from the United States Student department, Institute of International Education, 1 East 67th street, New York 21, New York.

Deadlines for applications for the Colombian and NATO awards closes Dec. 1 and for the Ceylon awards Dec. 15. Although deadlines for scholarships for the other countries are somewhat later, applicants are urged by the Institute to apply immediately since time is required to fill out the necessary forms.
