

Collegians Say 'No' to Use Of Bomb in Formosa Riff

MINNEAPOLIS (ACP)—Hostilities in the Formosa strait have simmered down considerably while lower-level negotiations between the United States and Communist China are being carried on at Geneva.

But the Geneva discussions will soon be coming to a close and the issue is anything but settled. If hostilities should resume the United States has pledged itself to defend Formosa. This brings up the question of the use of the A-bomb, and whether or not it should be used.

To obtain an idea of collegiate opinion on this issue, the Associated Collegiate Press asked the following question of a repre-

sentative cross-section of college students: "If the Chinese Reds should attack Formosa, do you think the United States should use the atom bomb to help defend Formosa? The results were 34 per cent of the men and 18 per cent of the women designating yes; 60 per cent of the men and 69 per cent of the women designating no; and 6 per cent of the men and 13 per cent of the women undecided.

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Civil Service Set Librarian Exams

The state of Oregon Civil Service commission announces continuous recruitment of library assistants to fill future vacancies in Corvallis, Eugene, Salem, Portland and Ashland.

College graduates are preferred. However, applications will be accepted from persons who have had two years of college or two years of library experience or any combination of the above experience and training.

This work is sub-professional library work between the clerical and professional levels, assisting in general library operations. It involves performance, without detailed supervision, of various tasks in connection with the daily operation of a library.

The examination will consist solely of a written test covering the following: general library procedures and techniques; reference source materials; book titles and authors; dealing with the public; clerical ability and accuracy in reading and posting numerical data.

Application forms may be obtained from either the office of the State Civil Service commission, 102 Public Service Building, Salem, or 304 State Office Building, Portland, or from any local office of the Oregon State Employment Service.

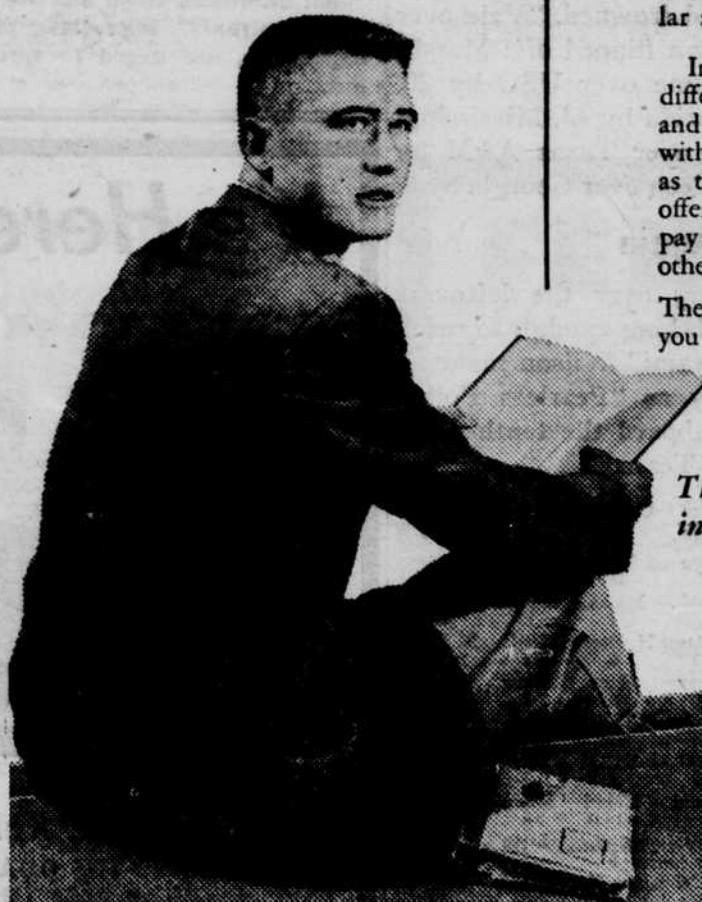
