

'Macbeth' to Open Friday; Experience Keynote of Cast

Shakespeare's "Macbeth," a University Theatre presentation, will open Friday at 8 p.m. with a cast of many experienced actors.

Gordon Howard, in the title role, has had much experience in the UT and has won the UT "Best Actor" award twice. He was cast in the lead in "Kiss Me, Kate," and appeared in "All the King's Men," "Finian's Rainbow," and "The Contrast," to name a few. Howard has had Shakespearean experience with the UT, playing Falstaff in "Henry IV."

A Former Director

Howard, a graduate student, directed the UT summer night club series, "Club Intime."

Lady Macbeth is played by a newcomer to the UT, Dori Barsness. She has never played a Shakespearean role before, but has had roles in summer stock as well as in college and community

theatres. She is a graduate of the University of Iowa, and has toured with the Virginia City Players.

Ron Weidman, graduate assistant in drama, plays Banquo. He spent last summer studying Shakespeare in England at Stratford-on-Avon. Weidman, new to the UT, has played in summer stock with the Bar Harbor players in Maine. His past roles range from Turk in "Come Back, Little Sheba" to the title roles in "King Lear" and "Othello."

Tapscott to Play Duncan

Mark Tapscott is cast in the role of Duncan. He has had varied roles in the UT and played with the UT summer players. Important roles he has played include Don Gresham in "The Moon Is Blue" and the title role in "Mr. Roberts."

Tom Gaines, last seen as a gangster in "Kiss Me, Kate," plays the role of Macduff. He was also seen in "The Crucible" and "Blood Wedding."

Pat McCormick plays Lady Macduff and was last seen in "Hannelle."

Lennox is played by Irl White, who has had roles in "The Contrast" and "Member of the Wedding."

Kesey Cast as Scottish Lord

Ken Kesey appears as Ross, a Scottish lord. He has had parts in "Captive at Large" and "One Touch of Venus."
