mine whether the men who purchased the liquor and beer were of legal age.

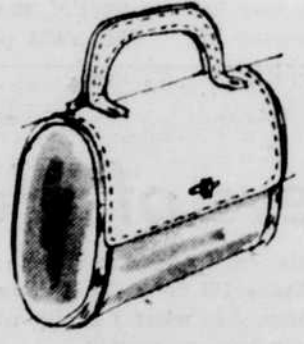
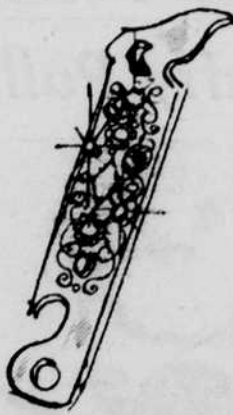
SPARTANS GO WEST:
