

Course Offered Men In Real Estate Field

Over 30 real estate men from all over the state are expected to enroll in the Real Estate Appraisal course which will be held in Commonwealth hall Jan. 16-28, according to L. R. Johnson, assistant professor of business administration, who has charge of arrangements for the course.

Curriculum for the class will include the study of costs, prices, and values as they apply to the appraisal field. Case study properties will be appraised by the students, who will then prepare

appraisal reports. Due to this feature of the class, it is necessary that all who enroll have a thorough knowledge of appraisal theory, equivalent to the completion of Appraisal I.

Instructors will be William W. Abelman, M.A.I., of Glendale, Calif., and David L. Montonna, M.A.I. of Cape Vincent, N.Y. Both men have had considerable experience in real estate theory and practice fields.

Sponsors will be the school of business administration, American Institute of Real Estate appraisers, the Oregon Real Estate boards and the Oregon Real Estate department.

The Institute will give credit toward an M.A.I. designation, upon successful completion of the course. No credit is offered by the University, however.

● **The rally board** will meet today at noon in the Student Union.

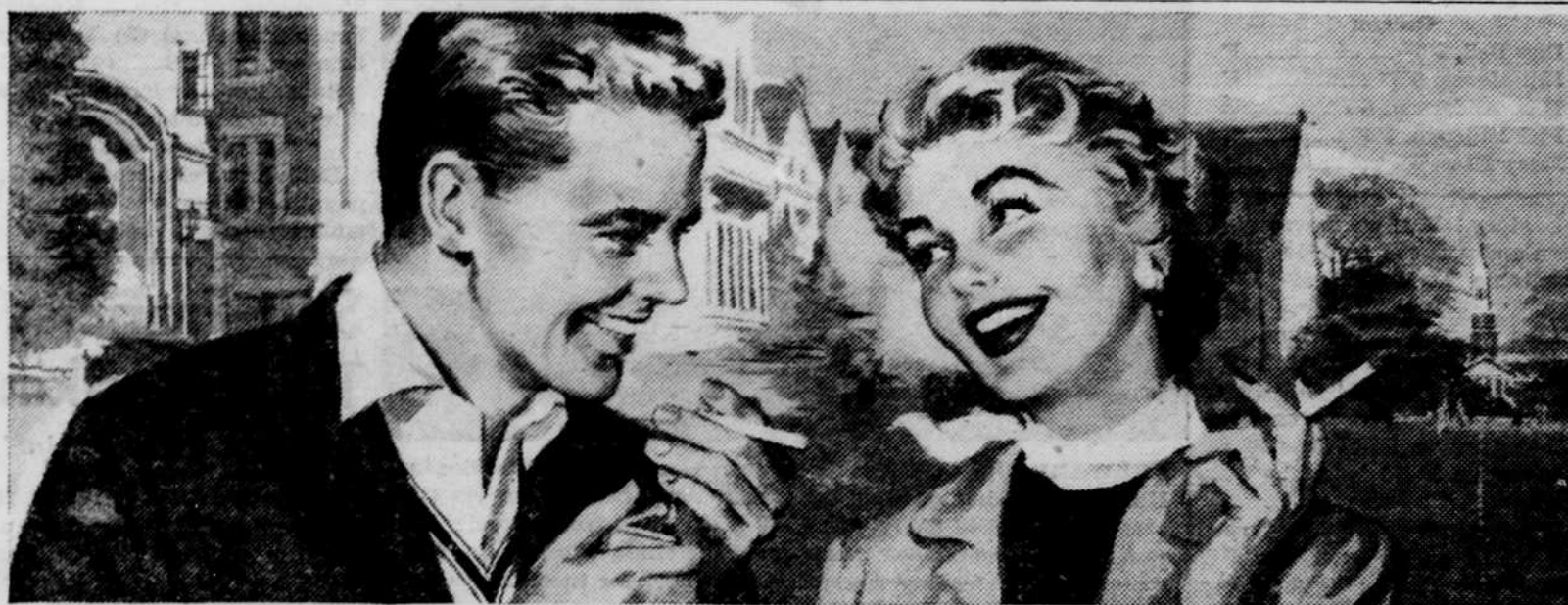
